Taming Technology, Taming Gender in the Twentieth Century

Ruth Oldenziel is Full Professor in American and European History at the Eindhoven University of Technology, the Netherlands. She has published widely in the area of history of technology and gender and besides, has introduced a more user-focused perspective inside technology studies. Her expertise lies in American as well as European History of the late 19th and 20th century. With Mikael Hård, she recently published the book „Consumers, Tinkerers, Rebels. The People who Shaped Europe“ (2013), and her book "Making Technology Masculine: Men, Women and Modern Machines in America, 1870-1945" (1999) has become a seminal reading on the gendering of American technology and engineering.

Ruth Oldenziel received her PhD from Yale University in American History in 1992 after graduate training in American Studies at Smith College, the University of Massachusetts at Amherst and the University of Amsterdam. She has been guest researcher and lecturer at many distinguished places, among them the Universities of Stanford or Princeton, and institutions such as the Smithsonian Institution (Washington), the Netherlands Institute for Advanced Studies, the Science Museum London, and the Rachel Carson Center in Munich.
